One of the most awe-inspiring things we get to witness at the Alabama-West Florida Development Fund and UM Foundation is God working through individuals and churches to fulfill the Great Commission. In the Alabama-West Florida Conference, churches, agencies, and missions are building God's kingdom in so many different ways.

The Development Fund was established as a non-profit in 1984 to provide a locally-based, low-interest loan alternative specifically created with churches and ministries within our Alabama-West Florida Conference in mind. The



board of directors is made up of United Methodists and AWF Conference staff with both financial backgrounds and experience in meeting Book of Discipline guidelines. Loans are backed by Development Fund investors who are dedicated to the mission and vision of the local church. Working with the **Development Fund, churches and** ministries receive step-by-step guidance through the application and loan process, financing options, answers to committee questions, and help with other needs that arise.

The Development Fund has helped play an important part in fueling the growth, expansion, and renovation needs of the AWF conference for over 37 years, loaning more than \$20.5 million to churches, agencies, and ministries in the AWF Conference. Loans generally fall under the categories of new church construction, purchasing property, or major renovation projects. Loans across our conference have helped with refinancing large loans: building new sanctuaries and recreation centers; and expanding ministries through property

## Why Borrow from the **Development Fund?**

- Low-interest loans for up to \$1 million.\* Rates are typically lower than commercial rates, and Development Fund rates are currently set at 3.95% (this rate is set quarterly by the Development Fund Board of Directors).
- Loan terms for up to 15 years
- Fixed interest rates for one
- Competitive interest rates
- No points or closing costs
- Excellent service provided by the Development Fund Board, which consists of United Methodists with expertise in finance and banking and experience in complying with Book of Discipline guidelines for building and loan projects

**How to Begin the Loan Process** Three main goals to address when beginning the loan process:

- 1. Meet the Requirements: Meet Book of Discipline guidelines and requirements, get approval from the District Buildings and Location Committee, get approval at a called church conference, and fill out a loan application. The loan application must be completed with all relevant statistical and financial information about the church's congregation, and the proposed construction plan must be completed and received by the Development Fund office. The church must also provide a legal description of the property.
- 2. Secure Needed Pledges: Secure pledges from the congregation for two to three years of the amortization schedule (monthly payments). The church must sign a mortgage and promissory note and have recorded the first mortgage on the property with lien evidenced by a mortgage's title insurance policy issued by a title insurance company licensed in Alabama or Florida.
- 3. Save 10% of Proposed Project: A minimum of 10% of the total cost of the proposed project must be placed in a separate building fund account at the time the loan is approved.

# 6 Reasons Your Church Needs a Planned Giving Program



Living a generous life and giving generously are directly tied to the health of a person's relationship with God. Weekly giving during Sunday morning worship focuses on the importance of giving 10% of what God has entrusted to us, but what about the other 90%? The 90% often includes accumulated assets. savings, homes, cars, retirement funds, life insurance, etc., which are often given to churches and ministries with a planned giving program and proper policies.

When considering the adoption of a planned giving program, we have heard a few concerns about its effects on weekly giving and overall congregational interest in one; however, we have found through surveys, workshops, and conversations with churches that many individuals are excited to learn that their church has a way to make planned gifts. This is an additional way to leave behind a legacy while supporting the church's ministry.

Giving USA reports that an estimated \$43.21 billion in planned gifts and bequests were given to non-profits in 2019\* with most gifts benefiting non-profits, educational institutions, and other organizations. Whether or not your church is considering starting a planned giving program, here are 6 ways it can benefit your church:

- 1. A Christian Witness of Faith & Values: Most Christians' generous contributions end when they pass away. By giving to a church's planned giving program, an individual can continue faithfully giving even after this lifetime, leaving a legacy and a powerful Christian witness of their faith and values.
- 2. Maintaining and Continuing the Work of the Church: A gift from an individual's estate to a church's planned giving program provides the ability to continue supporting the church's ministry both now and far into the future.
- 3. Individuals Giving Larger Gifts than Otherwise Possi**ble:** While most annual gifts come from current income, planned gifts come from accumulated assets when they are no longer needed. A planned gift allows individuals to make meaningful and large gifts to churches and ministries that have have significantly impacted their lives.
- 4. Establishing Permanent Living Memorials: Scholarship funds, mission funds, cemetery funds, and other ministry funds are just a few types of living memorials that can be created in the name of an individual as lasting and meaningful ways to minister to others for generations to come.
